

A Library's Impact... a success story

I love the idea of being able to make whatever I really need or want. Shortly after the floods of 2013, I was at home, pondering how I would survive without access to all of the day-to-day comforts that I was used to.

My imagination ran wild, and I pictured myself trying to live off the land (a stark picture in the mountains). Food would be difficult, but not totally impossible. The same thing would probably hold true for



clothes and shelter, and winter would probably be terrible. With all of my thoughts, I was really stuck on soap. How does one make soap? It was such a basic necessity that I took for granted every day. I immediately went to the Answer Place – The Estes Valley Library and the Internet.

I started browsing the library for resources, and found a great book including a technique called French milling (similar to rebatching), as well as a few entrepreneurial books for tips on pricing and marketing. I found that many ingredients in my kitchen worked great for this and soon had a slew of funny-shaped little soaps.

A friend of mine encouraged me to join her table at the YMCA Craft Fair. That fair funded my future ingredients: essential oils, cocoa and shea butters, beeswax, clays, goat milk and more. It's gratifying to have learned what I need to enjoy a self-funding hobby!


Library Friends & Foundation at the Farmer's Market
