RESPONDING TO COMMUNITY NEEDS AND GOALS

In 2014, business recovery workshops were among the top priorities. Answering the need for collaborative training space, the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado and private donations built a new classroom adjoined by small study rooms. In 2015, the classroom is busy with computer and technology classes, answering the call of another community priority.

KNOWLEDGE AND CULTURE —IN BOUNTIFUL FORMATS

eBook use was up 20% in 2014, with more than 12,000 checkouts since the service launched. Readers can now access more than 1800 popular eBooks, 4300 downloadable audiobooks, and more than 30 monthly e-Magazines. Tech classes and Book-a-Librarian appointments help first-time users in navigating these convenient new formats.

ENSURING THE LIBRARY'S LONG-TERM SUSTAINABILITY

The Library's two support groups merged their energies and expertise into a single stronger Friends & Foundation of the Estes Valley Library. All their existing efforts continue into the future, including the Used Book Sale and the annual Benefit Dinner. Last August's dinner drew a capacity crowd of 225, enjoying a rousing and humor-filled talk by Wyoming author Craig Johnson.



A VISION AND A SPIRIT OF SERVICE

Quality and caring service is a top value for the library staff. Last October, Library Director Claudine Perrault was honored as 2014 Colorado Librarian of the Year. The award especially noted the Library's communityoriented service response after the 2013 flood. Perrault


stressed the award was not about one person but rather the tremendous collaboration among staff, volunteers, the Library's Board of Trustees, and the hometown support of the Estes Valley.



The Friends & Foundation are excited to welcome author Diane Mott Davidson to speak at the August 16 dinner at the YMCA of the Rockies.


