Sign Up for Facebook

Install the Facebook app on your mobile device and tap Sign Up or navigate your computer to facebook.com and click Sign Up


Enter your name, email address, date of birth, gender, and choose a password

Check your email for a confirmation request from Facebook

Must be connected to Internet & have a secure password that won't be forgotten

Set a profile picture and cover photo, start finding friends, and fill in your About profile information

information on your Timeline to be visible only to **Friends**. In this case, this is how your Timeline would appear to your friends:



By contrast, this is how it would appear to someone who isn't your friend on Facebook. Notice how most of the information is hidden, but the **name**, **profile photo**, and **cover photo** are still visible.

Privacy Concerns

Post what you are comfortable being seen by your mom, employer, and clients, even if you aren't Facebook friends with them

Accept friend requests from people you know and trust

Review Facebook's Privacy Settings at least quarterly, because options change without notice

Your Home Page

Your home page is what you see when you log into Facebook. It includes your News Feed, the constantly updating list of posts from friends, Pages and other connections you've made. You can react to things you see or search for people and topics that matter to you. Learn how to control what you see in News Feed.

Friending

You should send friend requests to friends, family and other people on Facebook you know and trust. You can add a friend by searching for them and sending them a friend request. If they accept, you automatically follow that person, and they automatically follow you — which means that you may see each other's posts in News Feed.

How to Add Friends

How do I add a friend on Facebook?

To add a friend:

- 1 Click the search bar at the top of any page.
- 2 Type your friend's name, email or mobile phone number in the search bar and click Q. If you don't see your friend, try clicking **People.**
- 3 To send someone a friend request, click Add Friend next to their profile picture. Some


To post a status update:

One of the most common things people share on Facebook is a **status update**—a short text-based post your friends can read and comment on. When you post a status update, it will appear on your Timeline, as well as on your friends' News Feeds.

1. **Type** your status update in the **Publisher** on the **News Feed** or your **Timeline**.



2. Check the **audience selector** to make sure you're sharing the post with the desired audience. In this example, we only want to share with our **friends** on Facebook, so we'll leave this unchanged.



3. Click **Post**. The status update will appear on your Timeline, on your News Feed, and on your friends' News Feeds.


More types of sharing

Facebook allows you to share much more than just status updates. For example, you can share:

 Photos: It's easy to share your photos on Facebook. Just click Photo/Video in the Publisher. You can then upload a photo from your computer, or upload several pictures at once to create a photo album.



• **Links**: You can **share a link** to an article on the Web by typing or pasting the link into the Publisher.



Likes, comments, and resharing

Sharing isn't limited to the things you post on Facebook. You can also **like**, **comment**, and **reshare** the other posts and stories your friends share on Facebook.

Likes and reactions

Whenever your friends share something on Facebook, you can choose to **like** the post. This is just a simple way of showing your friends that you enjoyed what they shared. To like a post, simply click the **Like** button.



Instead of liking a post, you can respond with different illustrated emoticons, called **reactions** on Facebook. To do this, hover your mouse over the Like button, then select the desired reaction. If you're using a mobile device, press and hold the Like button to choose a reaction.



You can also like the **Facebook page** for businesses and organizations to receive updates about them in your News Feed.



Note that any Facebook page you like can be posted to your **Timeline** and to your friends' **News Feeds**. This can be mildly embarrassing or revealing, depending on your interests.



Comments


Whenever your friends share on Facebook, you can leave a **comment** about their posts. Your friends will be able to see whenever you comment on something, as will the friends of the person who originally shared the post. To leave a comment, simply type it in the comment box below a post, then press **Enter** on your keyboard.



Privacy shortcuts

The fastest way to change your privacy settings is to use **privacy shortcuts**. To access privacy shortcuts, click the **Privacy Shortcuts** button on the toolbar. From here, you can modify the **audience selector**, choose your **message filtering settings**, and more.




The Privacy Settings and Tools page


Any changes you make from Privacy Shortcuts will be reflected on the **Privacy Settings and Tools** page. This is where you can control some of the most important privacy settings on Facebook.

To access the Privacy Settings and Tools page:

1. Click the **drop-down arrow** on the Toolbar, then select **Settings**.



2. The **settings** page will appear. Next, select **Privacy**. The Privacy Settings and Tools page will appear.
